V. Both men and women are living longer these days in the industrialized countries. However, women, on the average, live longer. In general, they can expect to live six or seven years more than men. The reasons for this are both biological and cultural. One important biological factor that helps women live longer is the difference in hormones between men and women. Hormones are chemicals which are produced by the body to control various body functions. Between the ages of about 12 and 50, women produce hormones that are involved in fertility. These hormones also have a positive effect on the heart and the blood flow. In fact, women are less likely to have high blood pressure or to die from heart attacks. The female hormones also help the body to defend itself against some kinds of infections. This means that women generally get sick less often and less seriously than men. Women are also helped by their female genes. Scientists are still not exactly sure how genes influence aging, but they believe that they do. Some think that a woman's body cells have a tendency to age more slowly than a man's. The cultural context can also influence life expectancy for men and women. For example, women generally smoke cigaretter less than men. They also drink less alcohol on average. Both have been proven to cause many health problems and to shorten lives. Another factor that has influenced the lives of women is the lack of stress. Stress is well known to shorten lives. Until recently, women who worked were usually in less responsible less stressful positions. But the social habits of women are changing. Young women are smoking and drinking more than women used to. More women as working and holding more responsible positions. These changes may mean that the cultural context will no longer help women live healthier lives. However the other, biological factors in life expectancy remain unchanged.
